

GIRONA AND FIGUERES DALÍ MUSEUM (10 hours)

Leaving Barcelona, we will take the Northern highway towards the French border. After one hour and a half drive, we will arrive in the beautiful town of Girona, known as the “immortal city”. This is one of the most interesting monumental cities in Spain; due to its rich history and to the large amount of treasures we can find there. Four rivers cross each other in Girona and the city was built around them, which gives the old area of Girona a beautiful shape with narrow streets. Our first stop will be the Cathedral of Girona known as the Cathedral of Santa Maria. Its construction started in the 14th century and finished just 200 years ago. The main nave is 23 meters wide and is the widest Gothic nave in Europe. The stained windows are also one of the highlights of this Cathedral. The Baroque main façade, the Carlomagno Tower and the Romanesque style cloister are also very interesting. Before going on to Figueres, we will walk around “El Call” or Jewish Quarter.

After the visit to the old part of the city, we will take the bus again to go to Figueres, the capital of Alt Empordà, and the birth place of Salvador Dalí. The museum is located in a former theatre next to the bizarre ochre-color Torre Galatea where Dalí lived until his death in 1989.

We will have lunch at the pitoresque hotel Duran, just next to the Museum.

After lunch, we will visit the unforgettable Dalí Museum.



It contains paintings, sculptures, drawings and sketches by the artist. It is original and spectacular in keeping with the wonderful personality of the famous surrealist painter.
